Several Ways to Print and Prepare these Posters

1. Print the PDF 8" x 10" sheets on your home printer or at a local copy center. Tape or glue printed photos to the printed sheets.
2. Another option would be to download the PNG files. Use an application on your computer that allows layering of objects. The photo areas on the PNGs are cut out. Layer and size personal photos behind the decorated pages. Print on your home printer or at a favorite photo printing company.
3. Digital scrapbooks, posters, and prints are another option. Upload your finished (photos inserted) collage poster to your favorite digital photo printing site. Select a printing option from their website.

These posters make a decorative wall hanging or customizable portfolio dividers.




